Copenhagen:

Tivoli Gardens:

Also known simply as Tivoli, is an amusement park and pleasure garden in Copenhagen, Denmark. The park opened on 15 August 1843 and is the third-oldest operating amusement park in the world. It is a playground for young and old and a spot so full of wonder that it inspired Hans Christian Andersen and Walt Disney. Part of Tivoli Gardens' secret is that there is something for everyone. The scenery is beautiful with exotic architecture, historic buildings, and lush gardens.



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Bakken:

A short drive north of Copenhagen you find the oldest amusement park in the world. Located in the woods of Dyrehaven, Bakken is a unique amusement park, which offers a historic and nostalgic venue combined with modern and fun amusements and thrill rides. The park has 33 roller coasters (including a wooden roller coaster), adventure rides, bumper cars, spinning cups, giant swings, ghost train, 5D cinema, water rides, laser shooting ride, swinging Viking ship, a drop tower, carousel, arcade games, a Ferris wheel and more rides

The Experimentarium:

2018 Time Magazine listed this amazing science center as among the world's 100 greatest places – definitely worth traveling for. Here you and your family will learn about science by experimenting, by using your body and by having a great time together. It is science – the Danish way!



The Blue Planet:

A new aquarium built at Kastrup Yacht Harbour on the island of Amager. It is the largest aquarium in northern Europe, The tanks

exhibit around 20,000 exotic marine animals and 450 species. The aquarium offers a non-stop schedule of special events and happenings throughout the day including feedings, story time, children's theatre and guided tours.

Fredricksberg Park:

When everyone is tuckered out and attention span needs to be energized, this is the place to come and let the little ones run around. A continuous park of 64 hectares it was originally the "garden" of King Frederik IV's Frederiksberg Palace in the 1690s. In the 1800s the public had access to the palace park and enjoyed the many points of interest like the lakes, canals, grottos, waterfalls, pavilions and summerhouses.



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Rosenborg Castle:


Rosenborg Castle is 400 years old, it was built in the renaissance style by Christian IV and the castle was his favorite home and place for throwing lavish parties. Visitors to the castle can see the rooms which are decorated in period furniture and art including authentic artifacts which belonged to Christian IV and his heirs. The castle museum has been arranged so that you feel like you are walking through the royal home. Visitors can explore the basement, ground floor and two upper floors.
